# Alliteration: A Poetic Device

Alliteration involves the repetition of consonant sounds at the beginning of words to create rhythm.

# Anaphora Explained

Anaphora is the **repetition** of a word or phrase at the beginning of successive clauses or sentences.



# Hyperbole: Exaggeration at its Finest

Hyperbole is an **extravagant exaggeration** used for emphasis, creating a dramatic effect and capturing attention.



# Understanding Irony in Poetry

Irony is a literary device where **the opposite** of what is expected occurs, often creating a humorous effect.



# Understanding Oxymoron

An oxymoron is a figure of speech that combines contradictory terms to create a unique expression.



# Onomatopoeia Explained

Onomatopoeia refers to words that imitate sounds, such as “buzz” or “clang,” enhancing poetic expression.



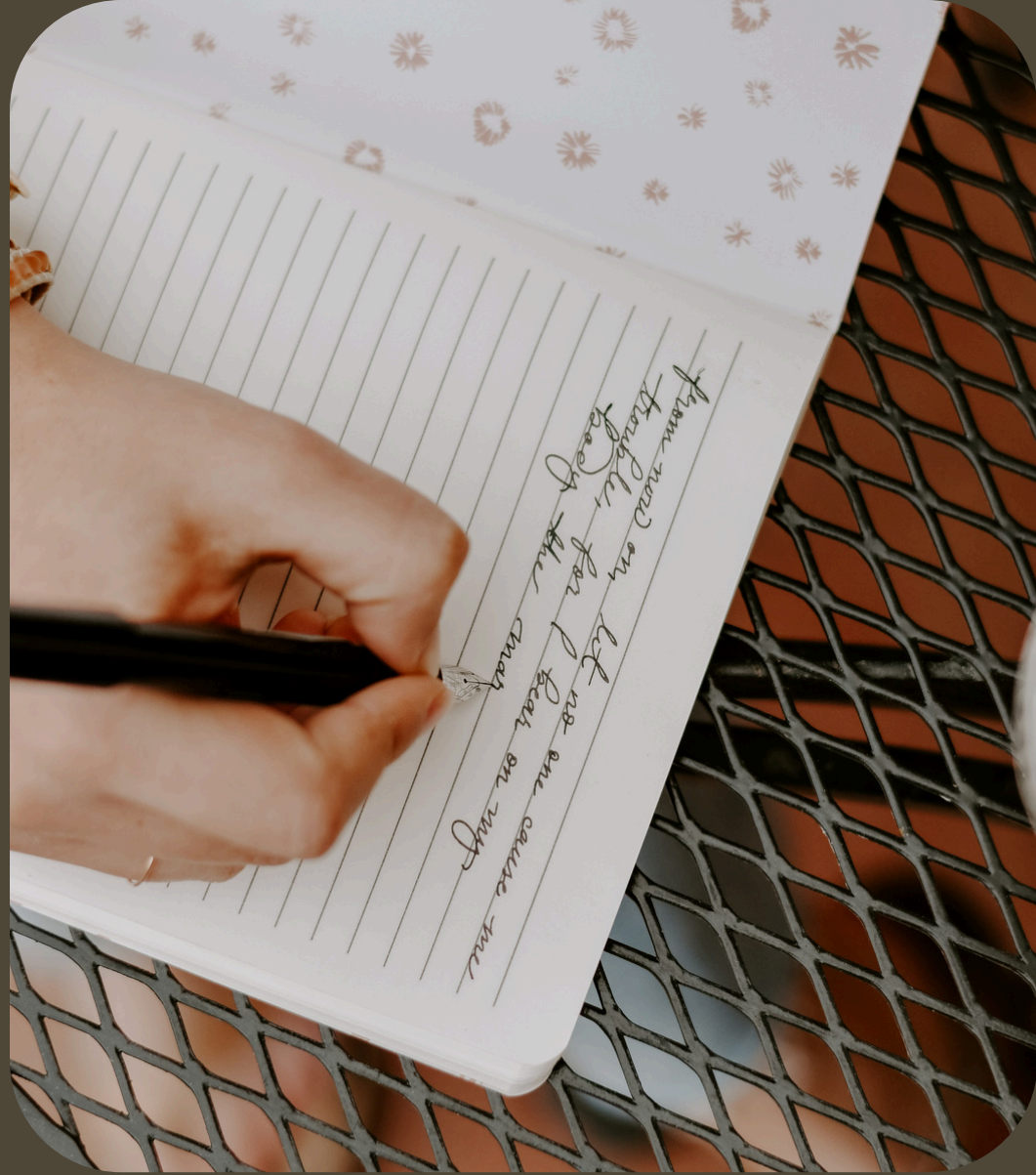
# Allusion: A Poetic Device

Imagery uses vivid language to create **mental pictures** and evoke sensory experiences for the reader.



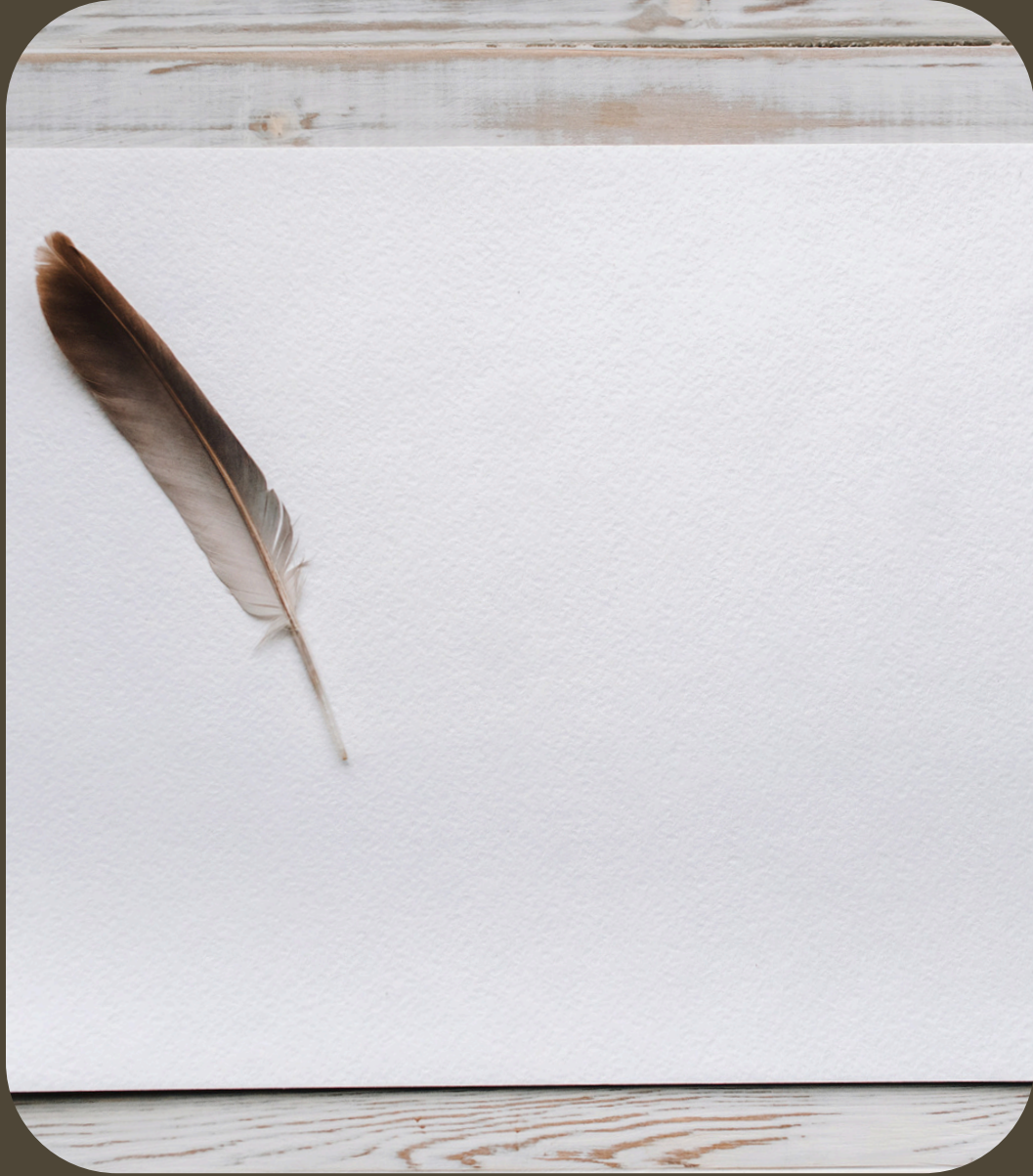
# Understanding Repetition in Poetry
