Understanding Similes



Definition

A
comparison
using "like"
or "as"



Examples

"As brave as
a lion";
"Sleeps like
a baby"



Purpose

To create vivid
imagery and
enhance
understanding



Importance

Commonly
used in poetry
and everyday
language

Understanding Metaphors



Definition

A direct comparison without "like" or "as"



Examples

"Time is a thief"; "The world is a stage"



Usage

Common in poetry and everyday language



Importance

Enhances imagery and understanding of concepts

Definitions and examples sourced from literature studies.

Understanding the Refrain



Definition

A repeated line for **emphasis** and rhythm in poetry



Purpose

Creates a **memorable effect** and engages the reader



Usage

Often used to reflect **emotional intensity** in verses



Examples

"Nevermore" in The Raven by Poe; "I have a dream" in King's speech

Understanding Alliteration



Definition

Repetition of consonant sounds at the beginning of words



Examples

"She sells sea shells"; "Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers"



Purpose

Creates rhythm, enhances mood, and emphasizes important themes



Usage

Commonly found in poetry, songs, and tongue twisters

Understanding Repetition in Poetry



Definition

Repetition involves **reiterating words** or phrases for emphasis.



Purpose

Creates **rhythm**, enhances emotional impact, and reinforces ideas.



Types

Includes anaphora, epiphora, and refrain in various contexts.



Examples

Famous uses include **songs, speeches, and classic poetry.**

Sources include poetry textbooks and online educational resources.

Understanding Anaphora



Definition

Repetition at the start of clauses for emphasis



Purpose

Creates rhythm and engages the reader's attention



Examples

"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times..."



Variations

Can be used in poetry and speeches effectively

Understanding Epiphora



Definition

Repetition at the end of clauses for emphasis



Characteristics

Creates rhythm and reinforces key ideas in poetry



Examples

"I want pizza, he wants pizza, we all want pizza!"



Usage

Commonly used in speeches and song lyrics for effect

Understanding Synecdoche



Definition

A figure of speech where a part represents the whole.



Examples

Common phrases include "all hands on deck" and "the White House."



Usage

Often used in literature and everyday speech for emphasis.



Importance

Enhances imagery and connection to the audience's experience.

Understanding Enjambment



Definition

A continuation without a pause beyond the line's end



Examples

"I think that I shall never see /
A poem lovely as a tree."



Usage

Common in modern poetry for fluidity and emotion



Importance

Enhances rhythm and flow, engaging readers more deeply

Understanding Transferred Epithet



Definition

An adjective linked to one noun but applies to another



Examples

"The weary road,"
"sleepless night," and
"restless sleep"



Effects

Enhances imagery, creates emotional depth, and adds nuance



Usage

Common in poetry, literature, and expressive language styles
